# Defects in Line-Engraved Stamps of France

Don't fall for supposed breaks in the outer line on line-engraved stamps such as the 90c brown of 1931 with the bridge at Lyon. Examination of these shows that there is a "dry print" of the line where the break appears at sight. The variety is simply an accident of inking-for some reason or other, perhaps even a globule of foreign matter (such as water) within the it does not fill the line at the particular point, and only the remnant of ink from previous impression is there to print at all.

The cancellations are similar to the 10 cent; there is no sideways variety but a variety with impression visible on the back is common. The pin perf. and Granet reprint (vermillion on yellow) occur. Many copies have suffered sulfurization (wrongly called "oxidized" by some)-peroxide may restore them, otherwise they are not collectible except for cancels.

# Opportunities To Specialize in General Issues of the Colonies

## By Robert G. Stone

In a previous article we developed the possibilities for specialized collecting of the loc Eagle of the Colonies General Issue. Several other stamps lend themselves to similar inexpensive handling: accordingly we continue in similar

procedure on a few of these.

40 Cent Eagle Type: (Scott No. 5: \$1.00 mint,
