I could not locate the Prince Imperial essays, and finally ran on a record showing that I sold them some four years or so ago.

But I did locate a number of fantasies, which I enclose. This material was my father's; and those which are mounted on card with two little dots of gum show how he mounted stamps around 1890 to 1900. He then similarly affixed the card to the gray album pages he used—these show the page-remnant on the backs of the cards. With care one can loosen the gum dots by wetting front of stamp, keeping it wet at just those pents for a time-about 20 minutes it takes me. Then they come off with almost no loess of their own gum.
