## PREFACE

The first two cumulative Indexes of the Philatelist, included in Whole Nos. 43 and 71, prepared by Catherine W. Menninger, were simple subject indexes; citations were only to Vol. No. and page no., not to Whole No. The third cumulative Index, compiled by John E. Livesay, appeared as a Supplement to Whole No. 150, covered Wh. Nos. 1-146 (vols. 1-27); it was a concise subject index with citation only to the Whole No. There have been no annual indexes nor tables of contents.

The present Index is an effort to be more comprehensive in some respects by adding separate tabulations by author/title and for the various regular "Departments" or columns. The subject index follows the same format as in the previous Index. All citations are to Whole No. only.

We are well aware of the imperfections and limitations of this compilation, which were beyond our means to alleviate at this time. However, we will appreciate receiving notice of any errors of citation in the Subject Index for publication in a later Correction sheet.

Hopefully a future cumulative Index can be more refined in subject classification and cite to the page number; but the great effort required will await some other more willing hands. We do plan to include Tables of Contents in each issue and annual subject indexes, which should facilitate referencing.

The obsolescence of most philatelic literature is a fact of life; but it is impossible to know what researchers will be looking for later on, so cumulative indexes will remain an important adjunct to philatelic progress. Moreover, a Society needs to have a guide to its history and the Editor's task is greatly eased by an Index.—R. G. S.

NOTE: It is important to read carefully the introductory comments to each part of the Index before using.

### I. Register Of Issue Numbers By Date

Over the history of this publication there was a change in the numbering system in 1944 and several changes in the format of the logo and in the frequency of issue; the relation of volumes to calendar years was not consistent. To avoid confusion in referencing and indexing, at the end of 1944 the preceding issues were post facto renumbered with equivalent Whole Numbers to conform with succeeding issues, and members were advised to renumber their copies, as shown in the following tabulation.

For simplicity all citations in this Index are by Whole Nos. rather than by the alternative Volumes and numbers (printed in parentheses in the running heads of all issues after 1944). Note that some numbers of Volumes 17 and 18 were never issued and Vol. 21 was repeated, but no Whole Numbers were skipped or repeated. The relation of some Volumes to the months did not go by calendar years; the volumes coincided with calendar years for volumes 5 through 20, and from Vol. 24 on. Numbers per Volume varied from 2 to 8.

## II. General Information

Issues were generally bimonthly through 1957, then irregular in frequency through 1964, quarterly from 1965 on.

Supplements were issued to some Whole Nos. as indicated under I above; these were distributed to all members, exchanges, and deposits at the time of issue, but when back issues have been sold the Supplements were not included and had to be purchased separately.

The Philatelist has not been available on a subscription basis, but only as a perquisite of membership in the Society. Back issues and Supplements (while still in stock) have been on sale to the public, except for those Supplements containing the Membership Directory (which were distributed only to members). Regular exchanges of the Philatelist with certain other philatelic journals are made; most of the journals received on exchange are deposited in the library of the Collectors Club (NY) or some other important philatelic library. The Philatelist is also regularly deposited in leading philatelic libraries in U. S. and Europe, as a service to the philatelic community.

Books and catalogs received for review since 1964 have usually been deposited in the Collectors Club library, prior to that they were retained by the Editor.

From 1941 to 1961 the organization was known as "The France and Colonies Group." On 5 Sept. 1961 the Group voted to apply for N. Y. State incorporation as a non-profit (from 1970 on "not-for-profit") organization under title of "The France and Colonies Philatelic Society." The new name appears on the masthead of the Philatelist from Whole No. 111 on (Aug.-Oct. 1961).

## III. The Subject Index

This index has been compiled in an abbreviated concise form, generally following that used in the Index for Whole Nos. 1-146 (Suppl. to FCP #150), which identifies the location of entries by citing only the Whole No. in which they occur. Until the last several years the number of pages in each Whole No. was so small that it is not usually difficult to find a cited item by scanning the issue.

Editors Rich and Stone (Whole Nos. 19-98, 118-) included in the Philatelist numerous short notes, personal items, news, announcements, comments, photos of stamps or covers, new discoveries, notices of new issues, and quotations from other publications, etc. The subjects of many of these notes that were of topical or current interest at the time, are now of limited or no permanent reference value and accordingly many of them have not been indexed. Other such short items are on subjects of continuing general interest or value to specialists and have been indexed (—ones with a separate title heading are listed also in the Author index (Section IV). The short items are not usually conclusive nor comprehensive reference sources, and advanced col-

lectors and researchers may be disappointed in many of them though some have original observations of value or summarize the state of knowledge; to alert users to this possible limitation we have identified short items by a code letter "n" (for "Note"). We have not indexed mere notices of new issues, nor "personal" news items.

The general subjects and various main aspects of the longer items are indexed herein, but the contents of such articles have not usually been analyzed in detail for all possible entries to index. Many of the articles, while sufficiently informative for general collectors, may not cover a topic exhaustively or comprehensively from a specialist's point of view (especially when the topic is one of broad or large scope). In any case most of those written a decade or more ago are apt to need some supplementation by reference to more recent discoveries and studies. (Obsolescence of course applies to nearly all philatelic literature not just that on France and French community.) Both long and short items which we believe are still materially correct and/or substantial in content or coverage are marked with the "\*". Notes or articles translated or reprinted from other sources are marked with code "r".

For many purposes the Author Index to articles, in Section IV, may be more useful, especially where the title is more indicative of the real nature and scope of the contents than a citation in the Subject index, and where one is looking for references by certain authors already known, or trying to find an article remembered but time of publication forgotten.

The last 15 years of this Index covering issue nos. 118-182, have been indexed in more detail than the previous issues. Some subjects, believed to be of more general interest, are indexed in more detail than others, and here the results may be a bit biased towards the concerns of the Editor, who probably will use the Index more than anyone else since the Index greatly facilitates his work.

The items coded with "n", as noted above, are short notes generally without bold-type printed titles; to find them scan the "Announcements and News," the "For The Record," and the "Meetings reports" in the "F.C.P.S. Official" Sections. Moreover, the reference is often to something buried within a note or article mostly on another subject—so don't be hasty and look carefully. There are sometimes several different notes on the same subject in the same issue—in some cases we have indicated this by a repeated entry, particularly if they appear on different pages in the issue. The code "(Rev)" means the item is in or refers to a book review or notice. Cited issue nos. connected by a hyphen denote a continuing serial, or an addendum or correction in a following issue.

For convenience, there is considerable cross-referencing ("see also") between subject headings and in addition many items are indexed under several headings. "See Also" cross-references are frequently given to alert one to the fact that articles of a broad scope may contain information on a number of subjects which have not been individually indexed—notably, for example, in case of articles devoted to Colonies In General which have not always been indexed also under each colony to which there may be some application.—R.G.S.

#### IV. Articles Listed Alphabetically by Author's Name, with Title and Issue No.

Nearly all the long and short pieces which have a separate title heading are listed herein. Mere lists of postoffices, rates, stamp issues, etc., (and a few very trivial items) are omitted—but they are in the Subject index. We have supplied the author's name in many cases where it is known to us though not indicated in the article. Where more than one issue number is cited for a given title it can signify one or more of several things:—there were continuations (installments in successive issues, or later addenda or corrections (usually short), or comments by others in a later issue, or a complete revision by the author at some much later time (which is listed again under its own separate title).

Note that in the period up to 1963 there was a considerable number of translations and reprints from other sources, coded "t" and "r" resp.

Items which we consider to be important contributions or surveys (and, even if old, still valuable for reference) are coded with a "\*". Ones generally out-of-date or superceded but useful as introductions for a general collector are coded "u". Some other older generally out-of-date items may have some original data or observations, or an historical interest for a specialist tracing the evolution of knowledge about a topic.

For some purposes this Listing may be more useful than the Subject Index, or should be used in conjunction with the latter, because titles will be more revealing and the author's name or reputation may be more indicative of the value of an item. You may remember an article but not the date or issue it appeared in.

A given author's various articles are listed in the chronological sequence in which they appeared in the Philatelist.

This section is included mainly for the special convenience of the officers of the Society and the Editor in connection with their "work," but the "Reviews" listing should be of general interest.

#### A. The “For The Record” Column

This was begun in Wh. issue No. 118, presenting short items, consecutively numbered, but untitled, devoted to reports of new or interesting discoveries, unusual stamps, postmarks, or covers, answers to queries from members, abstracts of recent research studies, comment on philatelic problem, etc. They are nearly all indexed in the Subject Index but, lacking separate titles, do not show up in the Author Index listing. As reference by others is often made to these items by their "FtR" No., the table below will facilitate locating the issue in which they appeared. Note that "FtR" did not appear in every Whole No. after No. 118 and that for a period items suitable for "FtR" were placed instead in the "Announcements and News" Department (Whole nos. 132-147).

### C. The Platters Corner

The Department, prepared by John E. Lievsay, began in Whole No. 170, but does not appear in every issue since then. As several topics are often covered in the "Corner" in any one issue without separate headings, the contents are only indexed in the Subject Index. ### D. The "F.C.P.S. OFFICIAL" Department.

The formal reporting of all the various official decisions, actions, policies, and activities of the Society under one heading only began with Whole No. 118, Sept. 1964. Prior to that some of the decisions, policies, and activities were occasionally reported as filler notes. The Department has more or less regularly included: President's Letters, elections of officers, appointments to non-elective positions, notes on actions taken by the Board of Directors, annual reports of the Treasurer and Corresponding Secretary, summaries of presentations at regular meetings, announcements of awards, competitions, special and out of town meetings, social affairs (banquets), stamp-show activities, special projects, lists of new members, members resigned, deceased or dropped for NPD, changes of address, etc. Most of these categories are indexed below; the contents of the talks at regular meetings are indexed in the Subject Index. **E. "New Books, Pamphlets, and Catalogs" Department**

The department began in Whole no. 118, Sept. 1964 continued regularly thereafter. (For "Reviews" of books see Index V H below).

**F. "Current Journal Articles" Department**

Began in Whole no. 118, Sept. 1964, continued regularly thereafter with several interruptions.

**G. "Announcements and News" Department**

Began in whole no. 118, Sept. 1964, and followed almost regularly thereafter. Generally devoted to brief notices of new issues, philatelic events and personalities, deaths, PTT policies, new discoveries, new publications, special meetings and shows, awards to members, activities of members, auctions, editorial comments, etc.

Many items in it are indexed in the Subject Index, but none are in the Author Index. In Whole nos. 132-147 the Dept. included some items of the type which otherwise would have been put in the "For The Record" department which was temporarily discontinued in those nos. Indexed items are indicated by the suffix "n" in the Subject Index.

**H. "Reviews" of Books, Pamphlets, Journals, and Catalogs**

Separate listing of these is given below as they are not indexed in the Subject nor Author Indexes. Most of the publications reviewed were also listed in the "New Books, etc." Dept. at about the same time. The listing is alphabetical by author or in absence of an author by the first main or most important word of title. (A few reviews are referenced in the Subject Index by a "Rev." after the issue no.)

### The Raoul Lesgor Awards for Best Research on 20th Century France or Colonies

This award was established in 1950 at the instigation of R. Lesgor as part of the awards to be given at an annual exhibit of the Society, the other parts being for best exhibits of one stamps or one issue. In 1954 the rules were changed to form a separate class for Research, whereas for 1952-53 all exhibits were judged on criteria that allotted 60 points out of 100 for research. In 1960 the Lesgor awards for exhibits classed as other than research were renamed the Rich Award, and the Lesgor Award has been occasionally awarded since to some exhibits shown at the Rich competition. The 1961 award consisted of a cup.
